	Affidavit of the Supervisor of a Home Education Program Elementary Age Student (Kindergarten through Grade 6) Secondary Age Student (Grade 7 through Grade 12)
1. Purpose School Code §§ 1327(d), 1327.1	The Pennsylvania School Code provides that compulsory school attendance requirements may be satisfied by instruction to children of compulsory school age provided in an appropriate home education program. This policy sets forth the duties and procedures of the School District with respect to home education programs of students residing in this school district. (Note: a home education program involves instruction provided by a parent/guardian/legal custodian, rather than a public or private school or tutor. The term does not include situations where School District personnel provide homebound instruction to students unable to attend school.)
2. Definitions	When used in this policy, whether with or without initial capital letters, the terms described in this Part 2 shall have the following meanings:
School Code § 1327.1(a)	A. Home Education Program — a program of instruction conducted in compliance with School Code § 1327.1 and this Policy, by the parent or guardian or such person having legal custody of the child or children in the program who reside in the School District.
School Code § 1327.1(a), (m)	B. Supervisor — the parent or guardian or such person having legal custody of the child or children in a Home Education Program who proposes the program and is responsible for the provision of instruction in the program. A Supervisor must have a high school diploma or its equivalent, and may not have been the supervisor or spouse of the supervisor of a home education program for any such children, wherever located, which has been determined to be out of compliance with the requirements of School Code §§ 1327 and 1327.1 within the past twelve (12) months.
School Code § 1327.1(a)	C. Appropriate Education — a program consisting of instruction in the Required Subjects for the Required Amount of Instruction and in which the student demonstrates sustained progress in the overall program.
	D. Required Subjects —

At the elementary school level (kindergarten through grade 6), the following courses shall be taught in a Home Education Program: English, to include spelling, reading, and writing; arithmetic; science; geography, history of the United States and Pennsylvania; civics; safety education, including regular and continuous instruction in the dangers

Such courses of study may also include, at the discretion of the Supervisor, economics; biology; chemistry; foreign languages; trigonometry; or other age-appropriate courses as contained in 22 Pa. Code Chapter 4 (Academic Standards and Assessment).

School Code § 1327(d)		Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Policy, every Home Education Program for a student who has been identified pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 <i>et seq.</i> , as needing special education services, excluding those students identified only as gifted and/or talented, must address the specific needs of the exceptional

student, and must be approved by a teacher with a valid certificate from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to teach special education, or a licensed clinical or certified school psychologist.

The Supervisor may request that the School District or the Carbon-Lehigh Intermediate Unit #21 provide services that address the specific needs of the exceptional student in the Home Education Program. When the provision of services is agreed to by both the Supervisor and the School District or intermediate unit, all services shall be provided in the public schools or in a private school licensed to provide such programs and services.

Nothing in this Policy shall be construed to affect Federal or State law requirements relating to special education for students with disabilities in Home Education Programs.

C. Portfolio

School Code § 1327.1(e)(1)

The Supervisor shall provide and maintain on file a portfolio of records and materials for each student in the Home Education Program to demonstrate that Appropriate Education is occurring. The portfolio shall consist of:

- 1. A log, made contemporaneously with the instruction, which designates by title the reading materials used.
- 2. Samples of any writings, worksheets, workbooks, or creative materials used or developed by the student.
- 3. In grades three, five, and eight, the results of either the Statewide tests (PSSAs) administered in these grade levels, or one or more of the Approved Standardized Tests in reading/language arts and mathematics. At the discretion of the Supervisor, the portfolio may also include the results of Approved Standardized Tests for other subject areas or grade levels. The Supervisor shall ensure that the Approved Standardized Tests or the Statewide tests shall not be administered by the student's parent or guardian. If the Supervisor requests that a student take the Statewide tests, the School District will allow the student to take the test at the school building the student normally would attend, or other accommodations agreed to by the Supervisor and the School District.

School Code § 1327.1(e)(2) School Code § 1327.1(h.1)	The Supervisor shall provide and maintain on file an annual written evaluation for each student in the Home Education Program to demonstrate that Appropriate Education is occurring. The evaluation shall evaluate the student's educational progress, and shall also be based on an interview of the student and a review of the student's portfolio required under Part 3(C) above. The evaluator shall conclude with a certification whether or not an Appropriate Education is occurring. The Supervisor must submit an evaluator's certification stating that an Appropriate Education is occurring for the school year under review to the Superintendent of the School District by
	June 30 of each year.
School Code § 1327.1(e)(2)	The evaluation shall be conducted and determined by a licensed clinical or school psychologist, a teacher certified by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or a nonpublic school teacher or administrator. In addition:
	Any such certified teacher shall have experience at the elementary level to evaluate elementary students or at the secondary level to evaluate secondary students.
	2. Any such nonpublic teacher or administrator shall have at least two (2) years of teaching experience in a Pennsylvania public or nonpublic school within the last (10) years, and shall have the required experience at the elementary level to evaluate elementary students or at the secondary level to evaluate secondary students.

A teacher or administrator who evaluates a portfolio at the elementary level (kindergarten through grade 6) shall have at least two (2) years of experience in grading any of the following subjects: English, to include spelling, reading, and writing; arithmetic; science; geography, history of the United States and Pennsylvania; and civics. The term "grading" shall mean evaluation of classwork, homework, quizzes, classwork-based tests, and prepared tests related to classwork subject matter.
	4. A teacher or administrator who evaluates a portfolio at the secondary level (grade 7 through grade12) shall have at least two (2) years of experience in grading any of the following subjects: English, to include language, literature, speech, reading, and composition; science, to include biology, chemistry, and physics; geography; social studies, to include economics, civics, world history, and history of the United States and Pennsylvania; foreign language; and mathematics, to include general mathematics, algebra, trigonometry, calculus, and geometry. The term "grading" shall mean evaluation of classwork, homework, quizzes, classwork-based tests, and prepared tests related to classwork subject matter.

	E. Curriculum Materials	
School Code § 1327.1(f)	At the request of the Supervisor, the School District shall lend to the Home Education Program copies of the School District's planned courses, textbooks, and other curriculum materials appropriate to the student's age and grade level.	
	The Supervisor may also request the principal of the school to which the student in the Home Education Program would be assigned if he/she were enrolled full time in the School District to make arrangements for the student to participate in the statewide testing program (PSSAs) and the school health and medical services program under Article XIV of the School Code. The School District and the principal shall not be expected to provide any additional services beyond those required by law for a student in a Home Education Program.	
	F. Extracurricular Activities	
School Code § 1327.1(f.1)	The School District shall permit any student who is enrolled in a Home Education Program to participate in Extracurricular Activities, <i>provided</i> that the student:	
	1. Meets the eligibility criteria or their equivalent for participation in the activity that apply to students enrolled in the School District, including but not limited to requirements for physical examinations and physical fitness, and any height and/or weight restrictions. A student who is enrolled in a Home Education Program is only eligible to participate in Extracurricular Activities available to students who are enrolled at the School District school to which the home education student would be assigned if he/she were enrolled in the School District;	
	2. Meets the tryout criteria or their equivalent for participation in the activity that apply to students enrolled in the School District. Students enrolled in a Home Education Program shall be given an equal opportunity to compete for positions and participate in Extracurricular Activities as students enrolled in the School District; and	

3. Complies with and satisfies all applicable policies, rules, and regulations or their equivalent of the School District and any other governing organization of the activity, including but not limited to requirements and directives of School District staff, coaches, and administrators involved with the activity, student conduct and discipline rules to the extent applicable to Extracurricular Activities, attendance and reporting requirements applicable to the activity, and any insurance coverage requirements applicable to students enrolled in the School District.

When the activity requires completion of a physical examination or medical test as a condition of participation and the School District offers such physical examination or medical test to students enrolled in the School District, the School District shall permit a student who is enrolled in a Home Education Program to access such physical examination or medical test. The School District shall publish the dates and times of such physical examination or medical test in a publication of general circulation in the School District and on its publicly accessible Internet website.

When an activity requires satisfaction of school attendance requirements, a student in a Home Education Program shall be considered in attendance if he/she is properly participating in the full, normally-scheduled program of instruction under the Home Education Program as described in the affidavit submitted with respect to the current school year.

Administration shall develop a procedure to ensure that Supervisors and students enrolled in a Home Education Program have access to information regarding available Extracurricular Activities, their eligibility criteria and participation requirements, and application and tryout procedures and timelines. The principal of the school to which a student enrolled in a Home Education Program would be assigned if he/she were enrolled in the School District, or his/her designee, shall receive and review applications for participation and verifications that a student has met and continues to meet all eligibility criteria and requirements applicable to an Extracurricular Activity.

Except as described in the next sentence, the School District shall not provide transportation to students enrolled in a Home Education Program who participate in any Extracurricular Activities. When the School District provides transportation from/to a School District property to/from a competition, game, event, or exhibition at another location in connection with an Extracurricular Activity, and permits or requires students enrolled in the School District to use the School District transportation, students enrolled in a Home Education Program who participate in the Extracurricular Activity shall also be permitted or required (as the case may be) to use the School District transportation.
